



John McCabe-Juhnke earned a Bachelor of Arts from Bethel College with a degree in English and Speech/Drama Education. He holds a Masters Degree in Speech Communication from the University of Illinois and a Doctorate in Performance Studies from Louisiana State University. He is the Nelson W. and Gladys I. Krehbiel Distinguished Chair in Speech and Forensics at Bethel College, where he has taught since 1986. John has directed dozens of plays and musicals at the college and has numerous regional acting credits. In recent years, he has developed Theater Arts Workshops for Arts In Prison,

Inc. and Prison Arts Projects, directing inmates in theater productions at the Lansing and Hutchinson Correctional Facilities.
