Do you know of an ancestor that travelled back to Russia to settle a legal issue? Do you know of a very famous movie star that lived near Pretty Prairie? Do you know where our ancestors were originally going to settle, or where in New York our immigrant ancestors got off the ship?

The answers to these questions and others will be provided by our guest speaker Jerry Juhnke who will present "Interesting Happenings Over Our Last 500 Years".

Jerry Juhnke, son of Marvin, son of Wesley, son of Carl, son of Heinrich, has been researching Swiss Volhynian Mennonite genealogy and history for many years. Because his father liked to play the "Mennonite Game" (how are we related), Jerry bought a family tree program and installed it on his first computer to try to keep track of his relations. He soon became acquainted with Betty Hartzler which led to a lifelong interest in genealogy.

As a youth, Jerry attended Elyria Grade School and Eden Mennonite Church. He is married to DeDe (50 years in December) and has two sons, Ben (married to Emily with two daughters) and Gabe (married to Hannah with two sons). For 43 years, Jerry worked with Ameriprise Financial Services as a franchise financial advisor with his business, "Juhnke and Associates". He also enjoys music, travel, tennis and pickleball. He has served on the Wichita Symphony Orchestra Board of Directors and has

Swiss Volhynian Mennonite Genealogical and Historical Project

Jerry has studied Swiss Volhynian Mennonite genealogy and history for many years. A couple of years ago he organized a group of genealogists with Swiss Volhynia Mennonite background who would meet on monthly zoom meetings to work on a common online family tree and to organize historical information related to our ancestors. This was the start of the Swiss Volhynian Mennonite Genealogical and Historical Project (the

"G&H Project").

The goal of the G&H Project is to preserve and make available genealogical and historical information relevant to anyone with Swiss Volhynian Mennonite ancestry. Historical information for an individual might include photos, newspaper articles, funeral programs, awards, draft registration cards, marriage invitations, obituaries, audio recordings, video records or any other information that would help to

create an historical summary of that individual's life. The historical information might also include related information about churches, cities, events, organizations, schools, travel or other items.

By the time of our SMCHA annual dinner, many public libraries in the Swiss Volhynian Mennonites communities will have copies of the G&H Project genealogical database. If your library does not have a copy, send Jerry an email

he will send a copy to the library. The copy sent to the libraries will be a "privacy" version to protect any living individuals from the possibility of identity theft.

Sewing Wheat Event from September 30

A good crowd gathered at the Moundridge Museum complex at 8:30 on Saturday morning, September 30 and watched while the Turkey Red Wheat was loaded out of an old wagon into the very old drills. Soon three teams of horses showed up to be hitched to the drills while the crowd looked on. Then the horses, drivers, and drills took off in the very dry field. It was so exciting to see the action.

Several men checked to see that the wheat was low enough into the ground so that the next week's rain. would hopefully bring it up. Two more big, dark horses came from the back and were hooked up with two others, and we watched the drill pulled now by four. We wondered if the four were going to cooperate together but they did!

Beautiful windy weather, Kansas style, drove some to enjoy cinnamon rolls and coffee provided by the Gospel Mennonite Church. An added treat was that super homemade ice cream was for sale also! Spectators were encouraged to visit the Moundridge Museum, Cole House, and the other outbuildings. Items were purchased from the last day of Farmers Market producers, and people were able to make purchases from the Schweitzer souvenir table.

The next step in the process will be to with for the wheat to grow, cut it, and then bind it in about June. It will be threshed in August.
